ACADEMIC PROGRAMS AT TRINITY RIVER AUDUBON CENTER



We are your gateway to exploring the amazing resources of the 6,000-acre Great Trinity Forest. The habitat we maintain is a diverse community of plant and animal species within a unique mixture of bottomland hardwood forest, wetlands, and grasslands. A part of the City of Dallas-Trinity River Corridor Project, the center's 120 acres sit on a former illegal dumpsite that is now a reclaimed haven for wildlife with miles of trails and a LEED certified Nature Center.

We offer a variety of educational opportunities at the Center (and at your campus!) for your students to enhance their knowledge in environmental science topics, build relationships with nature, and become the next generation of environmental stewards.

LIL NATURALISTS (PRE K - 1ST GRADE)

In this 1.5 hour program, students enjoy an adventure through nature! The program includes a nature-themed story written by Audubon staff, a live animal presentation, and a mini nature hike where students use their senses to engage with the world around them.

ECOSYSTEM STUDY (9-12[™] GRADE)

In this 2 hour program, students participate in field studies ranging from bird surveys, vegetation surveys, and aquatic surveys to learn about the biodiversity at the Center and how it relates to the ecosystem services we all depend on.





SERVICE-LEARNING (HIGH SCHOOL / COLLEGE)

Our 2 hour Service-Learning program combines learning objectives with community service in order to meet societal needs and enhance professional experience.

Designed to complement your curriculum, students will learn about various prairie ecology topics followed by habitat management practices ranging from invasive species removal, plant propagation, prairie planting and/or data collection.

SELF-GUIDED FIELD TRIP (ALL AGES)

Explore the Center at your own pace! Our Audubon Educators will provide an introduction about our Center and what to expect while you're exploring. Field guides are available for teachers to borrow in order to help with instruction on the trails.

In this 3 hour field trip, students take a deep dive into the history of the Trinity River Audubon Center.
They will learn about the landfill, the community that took action, and how it has been transformed into an environmental treasure!

Our guided field trips are \$10 per student, while self-guided field trips are \$5 per student. For each field trip there is a required 1 chaperone for every 10 students. Chaperones within that ratio are free with additional chaperones being \$6 per chaperone. Our maximum number of students per field trip is 150 students. Group sizes larger than 150 will need to be divided into multiple days. We do not have food onsite and recommend bringing a bagged lunch. Lunch time is either factored into the timeframe OR you're welcome to stick around for lunch after depending on the program.
